What is Changemakers?

imed at young people, Changemakers is a programme of performance and theatrical workshops intended to help students to drive change in their lives.

By using drama and Forum Theatre techniques, we offer fun and effective tools that encourage young people to explore day-today issues, tackle social preconceptions, develop new ideas and foster positive change.

Young people can find it challenging to talk openly about issues such as relationships, puberty, self-esteem or the problems they face growing up.

Our range of workshops is designed to enable students to open up and express themselves.

Through theatre we create safe, relaxed spaces where opportunities are available for participation and enjoyment, so that students can engage actively and increase their confidence, fully participating in discussions and ultimately making more informed choices.

Changemakers proposes a unique space for active learning that in turn serves as a rehearsal for life.



Workshop Activities

We offer two different workshops with a choice of any four topics.

1. FORUM THEATRE PERFORMANCE

► 2hr-session ➤ Topic to be chosen from list

Forum Theatre is a fully interactive performance followed by a safe group dynamic in which the young people in the audience will have the chance to get up on stage and solve some of the problems the characters face. The show triggers a frank discussion with particular emphasis on the emotions involved on both sides of a dilemma.

Three stages:

1. Professional actors dramatise a **conflict** related to the selected topic (Bullying, Sexual Health and Teenage Pregnancy, etc.)

2. Students work out solutions to the characters' problems through role play. Rather than simply offering suggestions from the sidelines, they will need to come up on stage to play out each solution for themselves.

3. **Open discussion**. The audience is prompted to analyse and to discuss the issues affecting their lives and their community.

2. CHANGEMAKERS WORKSHOP



This workshop helps students develop their critical thinking around a variety of K3 and K4 topics. By using Theatre of the Oppressed games and activities, we encourage participants to articulate their own experiences, go beyond their limits and understand life from different perspectives.

Changemakers is a project where students themselves take ownership of the process of creating their very own Theatre Forum pieces and take the lead in the discussion of the whole experience.

The theatre techniques employed help the students identify those issues they want to explore more deeply.

SCHOOL FOR PARENTS

Parents also play a crucial role in helping to shape young people's experience of adolescence, which can be a difficult period of adjustment. Their child is going through rapid physical changes as well as emotional ups and downs. Peer influences and social media are also worrving, as they can cause interference with child relationships and stress.

Forum Theatre performances or workshops based on the same topics that were developed for the children can be adapted to suit parents with the aim of supporting them in:

- Conflict resolution in the education of children
- How to educate children in the sensible use of new technoloaies
- Talking to children about difficult issues.
