Role Play for Training

Role play gives your trainees or staff the opportunity to practise skills in a realistic and authentic scenario. It allows them to improve their performance through simulated situations and supports the transfer of learning to the workplace.

With professional role players, you can create a safe environment for participants to practise, enabling them to try out different approaches and to learn how to deal with difficult people or situations.

Forum Theatre Training

To explore in depth challenging situations in the workplace in a participative manner

If you want to try something different, Forum Theatre techniques can be an effective addition to your training event and a way to truly involve your participants.

Forum Theatre is a fully interactive performance portraying a challenging situation followed by a safe group dynamic in which your staff/trainees will have the chance to take to the stage as 'directors' to suggest solutions to some of the issues shown.

This theatrical presentation triggers a frank discussion with particular emphasis on the behaviours and emotions involved on both sides of a dilemma and empowers participants to provide effective solutions to customer-facing problems, when they arise, and better engage with service users.

The session consists of three **stages**:

- **1.** Professional actors dramatise a conflict related to a topic of your choice.
- **2.** Your staff/trainees work out solutions to the characters' problems through role play. They can offer suggestions from the sidelines, or can come up on stage to play out each solution for themselves.
- **3.** Critical reflection and analysis. The participants are prompted to analyse and to discuss the issues and solutions suggested.

Forum Theatre is especially useful when tackling situations where there may not be simple clear-cut solutions, for participants to gain a greater understanding of the impact and consequences of their behaviour. It is an effective tool to identify concerns about practice and procedures, to reinforce company values and policies and to promote ethical principles and good practice.
